It was at 11 a.m on November 11, 1918, that the bugles blew the cease fire that signaled the end of the first world war. This was a day of rejoicing and a time of hope for peace.

While we in this country went back to our daily work, to enjoy our lives and make the most of the years granted to us in this world, the people of other lands were suffering from poverty and the despair brought upon by economic hardship.
