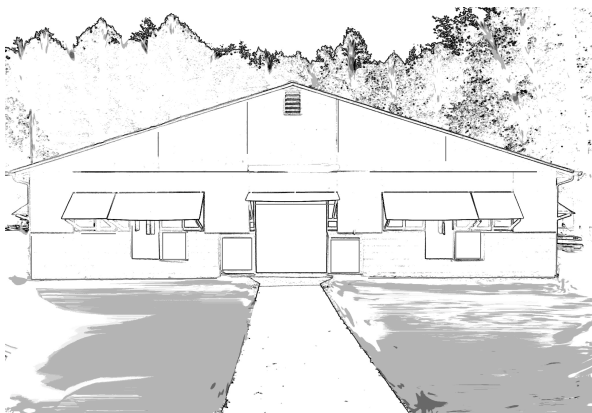
Ephesians 1:3-10
