# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOYCE:

Occasionally, when I type out the word "United" as in United Methodist Church, I transpose a couple of the letters and it comes out "untied." United and untied mean two entirely different things. Some, but not all are aware that we presently live in a time of deep division in the United Methodist Church. The main disagreement is over the issue of same sex marriage and the appointment of gay clergy in United Methodist Churches. A few churches have decided to disaffiliate or leave the denomination. We're in a time when the church feels more "untied" then "united."

In Ephesians 4, Paul writes to a congregation also dealing with some internal struggles. In his letter he urges them, live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is <u>one</u> body and <u>one</u> Spirit—just as you were called to <u>one</u> hope when you were called— <u>one</u> Lord, <u>one</u> faith, <u>one</u> baptism; <u>one</u> God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

His big message is one of unity in the church. Why? Because in our calling to follow Jesus, we are called to be part of something greater than ourselves. Greater than our opinions, our politics, our scriptural interpretations, or our need to be right. A former pastor of mine had a small wooden plaque on his desk that read "It's about Jesus, stupid!" It was a reminder that he shouldn't think of himself so highly that he lost sight of what was most important, serving Jesus.

The truth is that we will always see some things differently, but our unity, our oneness comes from Jesus and following Jesus. This is a great message for the United Methodist Church today as we deal with our differences.

In the next several weeks, we'll be sharing more information regarding the issues at hand and give some opportunities to ask questions. Until then, let's be mindful of the One who calls us and strive to be united not untied.
