# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOYCE:

#### 2020 General Conference in 2024

The 2020 General Conference of the United Methodist Church is meeting April 23<sup>rd</sup> through May 24<sup>th</sup> in Charlotte, North Carolina. Originally scheduled for 2020, it has been postponed three times due to the Coronavirus pandemic. For those who might not be aware, the General Conference brings together delegates from across the world. The General Conference is the body that sets official policy for the United Methodist Church, and it is the only body that can speak for the whole denomination.

During General Conference delegates will vote on resolutions submitted from across the denomination.

There are a couple of important pieces of legislation that will be brought up for a vote during this Conference. The first has to do with the restrictive language in the Book of Discipline (the governing document for the United Methodist Church) regarding homosexuality. The language currently reads that homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching. There is also a restriction that prohibits the ordination of practicing homosexuals as pastors and a restriction that prohibits conducting same sex marriages in United Methodist Churches. One of the resolutions that will come up for vote is whether this language should be removed from the Book of Discipline.

The second important piece of legislation that will be voted on is a plan for regionalization. The current proposal for regionalization would create four conferences: Africa, Europe, the Philippines, and the United States. Each conference would be equal in stature and would be able to customize parts of the Book of Discipline, to suit the conference's ministry context.

I'll try to keep everyone up to date about decisions that are made at General Conference.

I want to close with some words in a recent letter from Iowa Bishop Kennetha Bigham-Tsai: But friends hear this—no matter what happens in Charlotte over these next days, God is still God. Our church will continue to be the Church. And, we will continue to remember who we are as United Methodists in Iowa—a people steeped in a theology of grace—the unrelenting and amazing grace of God.
