A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOYCE:

I had an opportunity a few weeks ago to attend a short workshop on the post-pandemic church. One of the key messages was that for churches today, things will never go back to the way they used to be. It's not what most of us want to hear, because for most of us, we just want things to get back to "normal." It's a challenge, and it's also an opportunity. Instead of looking back, it's an invitation to look forward to finding a "new normal."

The presenter talked about the growing number of people who are "spiritual, but not religious." These are people who have a faith, but who aren't finding what they need in the church.

A few of the takeaways from the workshop included the need for creating a greater sense of spirituality in the church. People want to experience the presence and power of the Holy Spirit in the church and in their lives. They're also looking for a greater sense of community, the chance to build relationships with other people. And finally, she noted that the reliance on technology that we had to use during the pandemic (social media, worship online or through Zoom) weren't going away and that we need to find ways to integrate in-person and online experiences.

We know that Ivy Centennial is a special church, with a rich history, traditions, and a strong sense of community. But even Ivy has been impacted by COVID. In-person attendance is down, as people continue to worship at home, or have stepped away from church entirely. It's time to rethink what it means to be the church in this time. During September we'll begin a new sermon series called, "I Love My Church." We'll begin to unpack what it means to be the church today in how we worship, how we grow spirituality, serve God's people, and share the love of Christ. Together, we can begin to have conversations about where God is calling us to be as the church and the best ways to live into this "new normal."
