From the Editor

In this special general assembly issue I have decided to provide a little extra exposure to our itinerant evangelists known as the "lifers." By this term I mean those preachers and singers that have committed themselves to a lifetime calling of God to travel and minister the gospel in revivals, camp meetings, and concerts throughout the nation and beyond. The church of the Nazarene has recognized this collection of "lifers" by providing a specific "tenured evangelist" credential. The official manual of the church states: 509.3. "A tenured evangelist is an elder who has met all the requirements of a commissioned evangelist for four complete and consecutive years immediately prior to application for tenured evangelist status, and has been recommended by the District Ministerial Credentials Board and approved by the Committee on the Interests of the God-Called Evangelist and the Board of General Superintendents. This role designation shall continue until such time as the evangelist no longer meets the requirements of a commissioned evangelist, or until he or she is granted retired status."

The spectrum of tenured evangelists would run from Dr. J.C. Crabtree who faithfully travelled and preached for over sixty consecutive years and was planning to go preach a revival when God called him home, to our latest candidates approved by the Board of General Superintendents.

Song evangelism has been a long-standing ministry in the church of the Nazarene from its earliest beginnings unto the present. We are blessed with an abundance of talented musicians traveling throughout the church spreading the gospel through music. We do not have the space to picture all our commissioned and registered song evangelists, but we have included many of our busiest musicians in this issue. Thank you for taking the time to view these anointed men and women of God and we urge you to pray for them in the days ahead. 

The God-Called Evangelist

Ephesians 4:11-12

For some time, I have desired to write an article to share my burden for the church. I write this article after much prayer and following over four decades in full-time evangelism. It is with love for our great Zion (the Church of the Nazarene) that I pen these words. It has been my honor not only to serve my church as an evangelist, but to work with some of the greatest pastors on earth. It is with a tender spirit that I send forth this word of caution to the ministry of Christ's church.

When God built His church He established several offices for the purpose of spreading the good news to all people. Paul lists the various offices that He ordained to carry out His ministry to the world. There were apostles, prophets, pastors, teachers, and evangelists. He needed them all for the purpose of "perfecting the saints, for the work of the ministry, and for the edifying of the body of Christ." (Ephesians

4:12) It is not ours to alter, rewrite or delete these God called, God ordained ministries.

The apostles were given oversight of the church and were responsible for putting much of the good news in writing. The prophets expounded or interpreted the good news as it was necessary. The pastors and teachers taught the people the principles of the good news. The evangelist was called to take the good news to the lost-souls of the world. They were called the 'evangel-ist' for a reason. An 'evangel' is one who goes forth to announce the good news.

The greatest event that ever occurred in this world was when Jesus was born in Bethlehem. The day He was born the angel of the Lord announced His birth to the shepherds, "Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy..." The Wycliffe Version renders this verse: "I Evangelize to you a great joy."

The Lord's angel was acting as an 'evangelist!' God's order of evangelist is unique to every other Godordained office.

The evangelist has always been the head of the spear. They serve on the front line of the battle (spiritually speaking) and are very subject to the wrath of Satan, the enemy of our souls. Satan has always opposed this office of the church more than

any other. Evangelists of the past have suffered ridicule, mockery, violence, and even martyrdom.

Today, the ministry of the evangelist has been subject to derision, censure, and criticism and has been stigmatized like no other. We recognize that some of that criticism has been justified by those who have acted unwisely and have brought shame upon their ministry. It then becomes a reflection upon all evangelists. However, it is imprudent and an insult to Christ, who is the

Head of the Church, to paint with such a broad brush and accuse all because of a few. The same could be done to the other offices of His Church.

There are times when the pastor, teacher or leader of the church gets disturbed by the evangelist whose job it is to preach a crisis-truth. The evangelist's ministry is oftentimes to preach the Gospel pointedly and forcefully in order to bring souls to a decision. He or she must always preach the truth in love and never demean or embarrass anyone. The evangelist will oftentimes be able to bring a soul to a decision that has been delayed for months or years. The response to the evangelist is not alone the work of the evangelist, but the result of many months of the pastor's faithful ministry. The evangelist is not in competition with the pastor or any other office of the church, but rather we are laborers together in the winning of souls. "One plants, one waters; but God gives the increase." To God be the glory!

The ministry of the evangelist is essential to the ongoing work of the church. A poll was taken and

it revealed that a great percentage of people made their initial surrender to Christ in a revival meeting or camp meeting. This is not because of any lack by pastors or teachers, but rather because the express purpose of such meetings is to bring people to a point of decision. When the church ceases having revivals and using the God-called evangelist, the Kingdom suffers greatly. God knew what was necessary for the ongoing operation of His church and has given us

the various offices to carry out His work in this world. When we try to rewrite the order of Christ's church and delete the office of the evangelist, the church becomes anemic and ineffective. The tendency is to become ingrown and possessive and consider the church to be ours rather than His. When this occurs, the ministry becomes sterile and barren and the call to the crisis of the new birth or holiness becomes blurred by the murky haze of gradualism.

Since Pentecost, the church has never needed the God-called evangel-ist more then they do

today. The call and challenge to the evangelist was the last commission given by Jesus before He ascended back to the Father. "Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and you shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth."

Let each of us, be it a pastor, prophet, teacher or evangelist be faithful to His high calling on our lives. Let us realize that God is not redundant in these offices, but has strategic need for all (including the evangelist) if we are ever to accomplish His commission on earth.

I walked through the doors God opened; didn't kick any doors down. I'd pack my suitcase, kiss Vickie goodbye, and preach from town to town.

I remember many airports and several highway miles. I recall many kind churches and pastors with friendly smiles

There've been lonely economy hotels and "fast food" along the way. But the price has been worth it all, when they came to the altar to pray.

I'd stand and open my Bible, and preach the best I could. And the Holy Spirit applied God's Word, just like He said He would.


I've watched them stand up from the altar, committed to do their best, to love the Lord with all their heart and pursue true holiness.

Someday I'll empty my suitcase and carry it down the hall; reflecting of the revivals past, still thankful for my CALL.

And when I get to Heaven and search the crowd that's there. I'll find folks from revivals who came to the altar for prayer.

surrendered to the Lord with the help and ministry of Rev. Ross Lee from Richmond First Church of the Nazarene (Ross was Dr. Ted Lee's father). God later sanctified Dad and called him to preach. He pastored forty-two years and went to heaven in 2000 while I was preaching at the Georgia District Camp Meeting.

Mother lived her life to support Dad and the ministry and poured her life and faith into me. I learned to read by sounding out verses in the Bible. It is very difficult to explain the love and anointing on her life and her fervent desire to see me follow

Jesus. Around the age of five I was totally aware that God was calling me to preach—amazing, but true! For nine and a half years she invested her life in me. Praying, teaching, loving, and demonstrating what a Spirit-filled life is in reality.

Sadly, in the spring of 1961, her tired little heart could beat no longer. She entered Heaven at the age of thirty-two due to congestive heart failure. Needless to say, everything changed. Dad and I were devastated. I went to stay with his parents in Newport, Kentucky for a while as he wrapped things up. Thank God for the love of Rev. Roy and America Adams, who continued to pour love into my life along with my aunts, Janet and LaVona. Dad remarried shortly after to Linda Gray from Tifton, Georgia Church of the Nazarene. I began to rebel against God in anger over my mother's death and all the changes. I grieved the Holy Spirit out of my life and quenched every effort He made to call me back to Himself

My senior year in high school in Fort Valley, Georgia I met two young men who were ministerial students at Kentucky Mountain Bible Institute (now called Kentucky Mountain Bible College, then KMBI). The Holy Spirit really used them to impact my life as I was struggling to get back to Jesus. I graduated and went to work at Bluebird Bus Company in Ft. Valley, living a conflicted life of conviction, desire for God, and the carnal warfare of an unyielded spirit. By prevenient grace, I sent an application with a half-baked, semi-honest testimony of a seeker to KMBI. Amazingly, I got the last spot in the mens' dorm. Now things would really change.

Two weeks into this crazy transition, I knelt at the altar on a Sunday night and surrendered to the love of a Savior who loved me more than I could even wildly imagine. I went from the altar to the phone booth to call my stepmom to ask for her forgiveness, then from the phone booth to follow Jesus to a full surrender of my heart and future in sanctifying fullness. Wait, there's more! I found Elizabeth there.

Elizabeth embodied so many of the characteristics I had seen in my mother. I had to take a second look—and boom!

She amazingly said yes. She had felt



from a little girl that God was calling her to marry a preacher. I am that preacher. Praise the Lord!

We have followed Him through ten years of pastoral ministry in Kentucky and Ohio. God then called us into full-time, itinerant evangelism, and we spent six years on the road from 1982 to 1988. During that six years we lived in a forty-foot fifth wheel trailer and homeschooled our two sons, Ken and Rick. We covered much of the Eastern U.S. in revivals, camp meetings, youth camps, and retreats. It was a very fulfilling time.

Surprisingly, in 1988 Emmanuel Church of the Nazarene called us to be their pastor and God clearly led us to go to Orlando. We didn't understand, but we knew he called us there.

After about six years in that role we merged Emmanuel with Orlando First and Jon Gray and I began an odd couple ministry as co-pastors. We served together until January 1999 when Jon retired to further ministry in Nashville and we left for the road again. As I filled in for another evangelist at the Northwest Ohio District Camp Meeting, God used Reverend Norman Moore, along with a Harley-riding street evangelist named Bill Reeder, to speak to me about this call. The witness of the Spirit made it clear to Elizabeth and me that we were released from pastoring to return to evangelism and to the ministry we now have as a tenured evangelist.

This change of direction was a great surprise to many, including our kids and grandkids (Wesley, 18, Avery, 15, Grace, 10, MaryJane, 8, and Lincoln, 5). But it's worked out in a beautiful way. At this point, I have preached in 39 states and Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Canada, Mexico, Spain, Ukraine, Scotland, Northern Ireland, and England! There have been well over 10,000 preaching events and too many miles to count up!

Speaking of miles, the road presents many challenges. On Labor Day weekend, 2016, we were just leaving the Evangelists' Homecoming Camp Meeting in Vicksburg, Michigan. We prayed for protection, provision, and safety as we traveled to my ancestral home, Kentucky! On Tuesday, we would open Mt. Carmel High School's student revival and start a revival at Red River Church, not far from campus—thirteen sermons in six days. Not a problem, but busy (and fun). Not fifteen minutes from prayer and departure, a button buck deer jumped right in front of us. Wham—and flyer miles for the deer! We were shocked but unharmed in Big Blue, our Sequoia. This happened just about eight miles from the camp.

Through the quick action of loving brothers and sisters in the Lord, our wrecker was directed to Vicksburg Auto



Body, where we met a great guy named Andy. We were then delivered to Kalamazoo Airport at the only rental car place open on the holiday. A mini SUV was available to take us to Kentucky. You should have seen it; it was so small it looked like I

was wearing it instead of driving it. We got half our stuff in it and headed down the road thanks to Facebook and the "Nazarene Grapevine."

We made it to Kentucky and God really blessed our two concurrent meetings. He anointed and poured the Holy Spirit out service after service. He watches over His Word to perform it and it does not return void. All the while, we were on the phone with insurance people, Andy at the body shop, adjusters, and so on. After about five days we got the word that "Big Blue" was totaled! We did not see that one coming. We headed to the Georgia District Lay Retreat not knowing what we would do for a ride, and still wearing the rental as we looked to the unknown.

I confess I was a bit gassed from my thirteen messages in a row, so I turned the driving over to Elizabeth. Driving through Knoxville, TN I spotted a big Toyota sign and on what seemed to be a whim, suggested that we go in and look around. Thank you, Holy Spirit, for nudging us sometimes when we don't get what's going on. We met a cool salesman named Brian. In the process of explaining our complicated travel situation and what itinerant evangelists do, Brian told us he

was a new believer. He happily shared his experience and we had an immediate bond with our brother in Christ. We looked at a very nice, used 2016 4 Runner. The "rest of the story" is that we were soon retracing the miles to Michigan and Big Blue. She looked

forlorn as we unpacked her for the last time and left her for the junk man. Her 223,000 miles of great service were left in Michigan. We are totally amazed to start fresh with a 4 Runner six years newer and with nearly 200,000 miles less. Thanks, little deer, for getting us a new ride. There are lots of deer left in Michigan, so not to worry, sportsmen! My doctor, Gary Lehman, diagnosed me from a distance with "deer in the headlights syndrome"!

We are "all in" for this—no reserves, no regrets, and no retreats. In fact, God has in the last year taken me further and given me more than ever. He has burned my heart with desire to see our churches explode with His purity and power. We need both. We need passion, anointing, and a relentless pursuit of the Holy Spirit as He leads us to live Jesus out to our broken culture. We must stoke holy fires with prayer and intercession. He wants to manifest His glory in our lives! Two years ago in Wesley's Chapel in London, I asked Jesus for ten more years to travel and preach. We are believing for the best days of our ministry and are ready to follow His amazing Spirit into the last chapter of our little book. Blessings!






