PASTOR'S PULPIT:

The Challenge

Although the pandemic has been a harsh reality and a challenging episode in our history, there have also been positive effects that have emerged because of our mandated isolation. For example, God has granted us as a nation and as a world the call, if you will, to return to Him:

- Return to what we know is the right way to act and to be.
- Return to our biblical roots and seeking after the God who indeed created us in His image.
- Return to a life concerned more for the other and not so self-absorbed.

Plagues, wars, pandemics, and times of unrest have always served a greater purpose; and in a way, we can grow to be thankful for them. Nevertheless, it's always good to be able to get beyond our current crisis and move on to some sort of normalcy. Amen! The question is, did we learn, did we actually discern His beckoning to return? Did we become a better Nation or better person?

The reason I bring this up is because for the past several months we have been asking each of our three denominations to put their best foot forward by spotlighting who they are, what they believe, what they do and how to join. Being faithful and fruitful in a church family is not really about us, but for Him. Being a church member is not really a personal choice as much as it is a Divine mandate as well a privilege.

So there you have it. The challenge is before us. Have we heard His voice during the past year, calling us to come back, get involved, get right with Him, and serve His people? Have we felt His pull to join a church family: having a part of the decision making processes; having and being a voice in the direction our church should go; being His faithful teacher; dedicated Elder; Christ-like leader; inspirational choir member; supportive team member; or whatever role He would have you live out and be dedicated to do for Him? I hope so, not only for God's sake, but for yours...and ours.

There is also a coin collection container located in the Bethany Room as you enter the Sanctuary ... *feel free to drop in your spare change anytime.* Food donations for the pantry are accepted at any time. Place in the bin at the back of the Sanctuary.

All of the denominational information that has been handed out over the past three months *is* available on our Website.


Here is how to access:
