A month ago my mother passed away. She had been ill for some time. Dementia had robbed her, and us, of so much time we could have spent together, doing so many things that we could, should, or may have done. I can honestly say that the above poem is so very true. My life was, and is, richer, fuller, and more meaningful because of her. I had the privilege of being with her in her last moments and was holding her hand as she let mine go and grabbed the hand of Jesus.

This Mother's Day will be a time of reflection and wading through the feelings associated with grief. I miss my Mom. But it's not that I *had* a mom, or I have *lost* her, or she's *gone*. I get the meaning and the sentiments associated with these sayings. But each is only a half-truth! First, my mother was a devout Christian woman. For years her daily apparel always included her "buttons for Jesus." She wore them not only as a witness, but also a statement of who she was. I knew the first time I visited her and she was not wearing them anymore, that in a way, my Mom had already left us. But I must say ... that it's not that I *had* a mom ... I still have her. She is simply in a better, a much better place. I can still look forward to continuing my visits to her, but that will have to wait for a little while.

Until then I'm sure she is catching up with her own folks and spending quality time with them and others who had meant so much in her life: her brother, her Gram, her friends. Also, I have hardly *lost* her. I know where she's at!

I also can see her, even now, in the portals of my memories. Her words and mannerisms are still crystal clear. The way she talked is still fresh in my thoughts. Her smile, her gestures, none of these are lost; except of course that now they are reserved for the past and the future—they are only really absent in the physical present.

And finally, is she really *gone*? I prefer to think that she has just stepped up the road a way and is waiting for us to catch up to her. I know that over time even these memories will begin to fade. I will struggle to remember so much, and so many little things. But *had*? No, I still and will always have. *Lost*? Jesus found her long ago, just like He did me. And I think He'll just keep her company until I get there. *Gone*? Only in the sense that I can't call her and tell her this year, "Happy Mother's Day."

May all of us spend time this Mother's Day, in reverent giving of thanks for those we have the privilege of calling, Mother.


**This Year's Theme:

MAY MISSION EMPHASIS
