Pastor's Pulpit:

"July is the seventh month of the year in the Julian and Gregorian calendars. Its length is 31 days. It was named by the Roman Senate in honor of Roman general Julius Caesar in 44 B.C., being the month of his birth. Before then it was called Quintilis, being the fifth month of the calendar that started with March It is on average the warmest month in most of the Northern Hemisphere, where it is the second month of summer, and the coldest month in much of the Southern Hemisphere, where it is the second month of winter. The second half of the year commences in July. In the Southern Hemisphere, July is the seasonal equivalent of January in the Northern hemisphere. "Dog Days" are considered to begin in early July in the Northern Hemisphere, when the hot sultry weather of summer usually starts. Spring lambs born in late winter or early spring are usually sold before 1 July. July's birthstone is the ruby, which symbolizes contentment." (Wikipedia)

I love this definition of the month of July! The year is going by fast! Last month we considered the implication of the half way point of June. Now what about July? We get so used to the fact, and the experience that, for us July represents a time of heat, humidity, growth and needed precipitation! If we lived in the Southern hemisphere, July would represent a time of cold, chill, hibernation, and snow ... just the opposite of what we know and are used to!

This reminds me of the Biblical reality that in many cases and times, our view of what is happening in our lives just doesn't make sense. We are often stuck asking ... why? Why now? Why me? Why this? Yet from God's point of view, He is working out plans and details that we are fairly oblivious of and to. Scripture reminds us to often consider the reality of Romans 8:28: *And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.* In other words, don't lose hope!

How we feel at any given time, or what we perceive in any given situation, might seem to indicate one thing to us, but from God's point of view it is really the opposite. We look at things one way, but God sees the same things completely different! What's bad in our view is good in God's great plan. What's seemingly hurtful may in fact be a part of a greater healing! As Christians, He really does have a plan for our lives. He really does know the beginning from the end. And yes, He really can be trusted with everything and every day in our lives. If we could just really learn to think this way, to trust this way and to act this way, our lives may be what I would classify as a Birthstone Beacon! In this case, July's birthstone is a ruby, a dark red stone that symbolizes what many of us have been chasing for years: contentment! What would most of us do just to be content with our lives? For the Christian, real and lasting contentment, comes from another "Rock" ... one stained dark red by the Blood that was shed to provide God's peace, purpose, clarity and contentment.

You see, the "dog days" usually associated with July in the Northern hemisphere are not always days of drudgery and endurance. If we look at the word *DOG* from a different point of view and from a different perspective, we can see that spelled backwards, we find not *DOG* but *GOD*! In other words, God takes our dog days and reassures us that from His perspective, they really are ... good days ... great day ... **God** days. How can they not be? If our God is ultimately in control of our lives and is the unquestionable key to our being blessed with contentment, if God is really working out all things for our good, then *Dog* days are always *God* Days. Ah yes, the month of July can remind us and teach us that although time is going by faster and our lives are pretty much more in the second half than the first, God still is on His Throne and we are bound for His glory.

INFORMATIONAL MEETING UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

Last Sunday, (6/23/2024) our local United Methodist church members at United Churches met to hear about my recent trip to the Dakotas Conference of the United Methodist Church, held in Bismarck, ND.

I brought back many ideas/resources/grants available from the conference which could help United Churches grow. I will be getting the information to the different areas of our church so they are aware of these sources. I encourage you to consider helping in an area of the church which you have an interest.

As many of you know, on May 3, 2024, at the end of the United Methodist Church General Conference in Charlotte, NC, changes were made. According to the UMC website, (UMC.org) three key points were addressed:

- Delegates to The United Methodist Church approved four changes to church law intended to remove the last remnants of restrictions aimed specifically at LGBTQ people.
- This comes after a week of slowly removing bans and enforcement measures against gay clergy and same-sex weddings.

The delegates also passed a measure that explicitly allows clergy to choose which weddings they perform or don't perform.

It is fantastic that we support Walter & Cheryl Spicer in their work on the mission field. Walter is the nephew of Pearl Risinger a member of United Churches who passed away a few years ago.


BASIC NEEDS & BEARLY USED BOUTIQUES CHANGE OF DATE!!!
