### *From the desk of Pastor Mark Hollinger*

I love Easter for all kinds of reasons. It is the time when new life is busting out all around us. It amazes me to watch the landscape transform from a dirty lifeless brown to a refreshing and promising green. To see trees flourish with leaves and the front of houses to become adorned with the beautiful colors of flowers. To travel out in the country and see the difference in just one week announces the irresistible nature of God to produce and promote new growth and new life .

I love Easter because it gives me the opportunity to remember and retell the Easter story. And we tell it all through Lent, on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and then on Easter morning. We tell the Easter story of God's victory over sin and death in our singing and in all our Easter gatherings.

My first Easter as a student pastor was one of the most dramatic Easter messages they'd ever experienced. I had taken the Easter lily that we had purchased for that Easter Sunday and I had left it in my car overnight. When I got up the next morning and got into the car it looked rather wilted and near death. I felt so stupid for having so mistreated our Easter Lily but it was the only Easter Lily we had and so I got to the church early and placed it right in front of the pulpit on the altar railing in a place that was obscured by the pulpit so that I couldn't see it as I preached, which I considered a good thing since I wouldn't be distracted by our sickly Easter Lily as I preached my first, most remarkable Easter message.

I was on fire that morning. I must've been. You should have seen their faces shine and beam with amazement and wonder as I told of God's love conquering death and sin and bringing life where death and sorrow seemed to have declared its own victory. I felt so confirmed in that message. As I got into the car with Kathy to go to our second service I fell all over myself with self-adulation. I hadn't got too far with my high praise when Kathy asked, "You didn't see it, did you?" "See what," I asked. Kathy pressed on, "The Easter Lily, you didn't see it did you?" The Easter lily had come to life and full bloom during my sermon. It seems that my leaving it in the car overnight in a lowered temperature had placed it in a state of temporary dormancy and in the heat of the sanctuary it was revitalized and came into full bloom.

I was a little disappointed and yet pleased that God had blessed me and had blessed us with such a "miracle" of life. (I have threatened to place Easter lily's in my refrigerator every Easter-tide and then thaw it out during Easter service to recreate that Easter message, but I am sure that I could never craft the right conditions as God had on that first Easter message.) I hope that we don't miss the Easter message this year. I hope that for the first time some in our community may come to understand the Easter message for the first time this year.

A reminder that we will have a combination Maundy Thursday and Good Friday service on Thursday, April 18 at 7:00 pm and then we are invited to the Otterbein Good Friday service Good Friday, April 19 at 10:00 am. We will have a sunrise service Easter Sunday at 8:00 followed with a breakfast in the fellowship hall and then our regular 9:30 am worship.

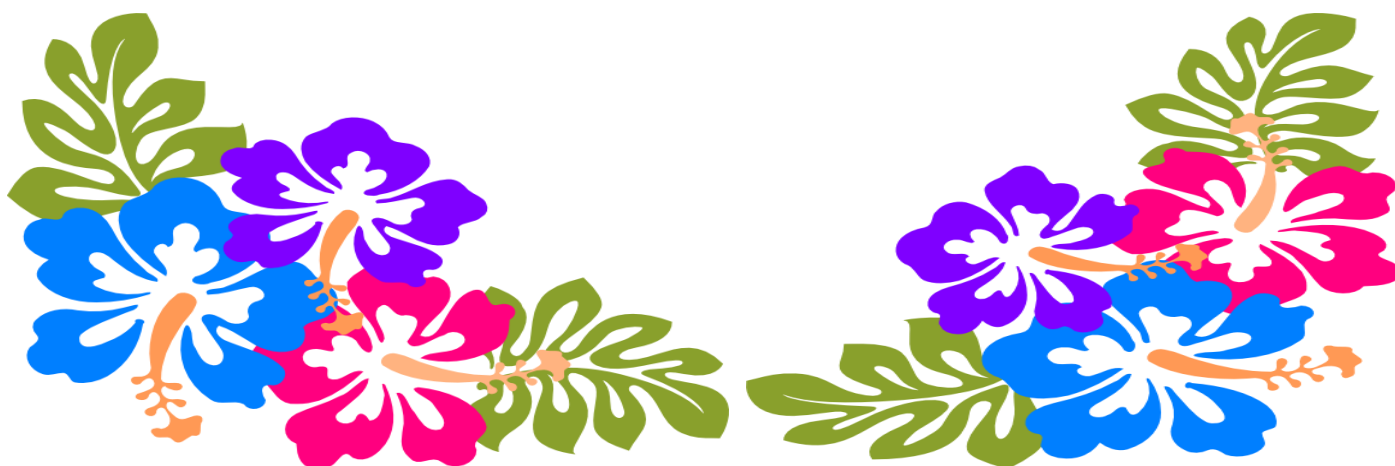
