From the desk of Pastor Mark Hollinger

I just recently went to Wapakoneta to do some shopping and it was the 50th anniversary of the moon landing. It was heartwarming to see the community and indeed the whole country and added affirmations across the globe celebrating this remarkable human achievement of reaching out into space and landing on the moon!

As the events and special programming unfolded I was once again reminded of the dangers of space and the subsequent perils traveling through it and therefore the extraordinary achievement the lunar landing represents. I have always been fascinated by space, our galaxy and the wonders of the universe. About ten years ago I was live streaming "The Universe" which is like 50 episodes regarding all the marvels and complexities of the universe including our solar system and our galaxy, the Milky Way. When Netflix took it off live streaming I ordered the whole DVD series online for my upcoming birthday and so I told Kathy that she got me the universe for my birthday that year.

I marvel at all the chaos and yet order that is found in the planets and stars of the universe. I marvel at the unique survivability of our planet in the midst of a hostile solar system. This, for me, speaks of a divine hand creating and ordering all that is in the universe.

I recently came across an article which had the headline: "As the Moon landing unfolded, Buzz Aldrin took communion. Here's why" Although it primarily focused on Buzz Aldrin and his own thoughts and reflections from his Apollo 11 mission, (he was there with Neil Armstong for that first moon landing) it also reported on the experiences of all of those who had the opportunity to travel to the moon and back. Without exception every member of those crews—whether landing on the moon or remaining in the command module had their faith and spiritual journey deepened. The article reflected that it has been a small and select group who has known what it is to stare back at our own blue planet from the Moon, to appreciate that perspective and marvel at the rare and precious jewel that Earth is. For those who had that experience in the '60s and '70s, without exception, it changed them irrevocably.




