PASTOR JACK'S COLUMN

A few years ago I began to question, "What is God's will for my life?" I knew what *my* will was; it included raising good kids, being a good husband, trying to be honest and helpful in my dealings with others, and working to save money while enjoying family. I'd guess my will was not much different than the will of many reading this. But was that really God's will? How could I know? In fact, many scripture passages address this!

Here's a short list to start:

1 Timothy 2:3-4, Matthew 21:28-32, 1 Peter 2:15, 1 Thessalonians 5:18, 1 Thessalonians 4:3, Luke 9:23, Psalm 34:7 and more...

I loved the Lord. I believed the parts of the Bible that I had read were true, and according to John 1:12, that made me a child of God. That fact made me reflect a little deeper. I asked another question: "What does it mean to be a child of God?" These questions must be connected, one answer leading to another. My human way of thinking brought me to thoughts of my relationship with my own children; they're mine, they know me well because they've spent time with me. They know what I hope for their lives because I've told them and shown them. They followed me from when they were young, and continue to confide in me now. I believe this is how relationship with our Heavenly Father works too.

I began to spend more time with God; one on one. Reading and processing His words. I discovered God's will really is knowable. Scripture proves this. Romans 2:2 says, "Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. *Then* you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—His good, pleasing and perfect will." This passage was actually the focus of devotion during a Christian event I recently attended. I realize now it actually provides an important guiding sequence for members of Gods family (Mark 3:35):

- 1) A child of God refuses to be conformed to the world; they don't desire the same things most others do.
- 2) A child of God allows themselves to be transformed, in submission to the Holy Spir-
- it. They request guidance.

3) A child of God is renewed according to the things of God, as we become more aware of His Word. Only when we read, spending time with Him, can we begin to know God's plan and perfect will.

4) A child of God lives their life, stepping out in faith, seeking to pattern their own life on the life of Jesus Christ.

No matter my age or my experience, I can know I am in Gods will when my life bears a closer resemblance to Jesus' life. Am I growing in holiness, standing out as different from the rest of the world? Am I willing to help others, even when it cost me my time, money, or energy? Am I willing to share with others, unashamed, the impact God has made upon my life? Am I drawn to reading the Word; more than just on Sunday, more than a couple convenient verses sometimes? Do I encourage other believers do the same?

I'm retired. I'm done learning and growing. I just want to enjoy the rest of my days without feeling obligated...

In his book, Rethinking Retirement-Finishing Life for the Glory of Christ, Pastor John Piper wrote, "Finishing life to the glory of Christ means finishing life in a way that makes Christ look glorious. It means living and dying in a way that shows Christ to be the all-satisfying Treasure that he is."

I follow **stopplayingchurch** on Instagram. Their latest post offered thoughtful challenge: "The "do what makes you hap-

py" culture is so toxic for Christians. We are NOT called to do what makes us happy. We're called to do what glorifies God. Christianity isn't always sunshine and happiness. It's hard work & dedication to Him, not us. Do. What. Glorifies. God."

If we are living in God's will, under His influence, and truly desiring what He wants for our lives we'll know. Holy Spirit will place His desires in our hearts.

If you seek God, He will show up.

"You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you. Declares the Lord"- Jeremiah 29:13-14 NIV

This is the first secret from the book, **The Secret Things of God by** Dr Henry Cloud. Dr. Cloud is an acclaimed leadership expert, psychologist, and best-selling author. He also has many videos on interpersonal relationships and leadership on Right Now Media.

Dr Cloud tells us you don't need to have the biggest faith, or belief, in the world. Just the act of believing enough to seek is enough for him to come to you. Seek and you shall find. Matthew 7:7

To live out this secret means that you will, first, take a step from your heart. So go to a quiet place and tell him you are looking for him. Pour out your heart. Ask Jesus to meet you and come to you. Ask him to show up in your life.

Second, you might want to do this with someone who knows him well. Get with that person and pray together. If you have never done that, it may seem strange, but you will

find it one of the most incredible spiritual experiences you can have. Ask him how he found God and what God does in his life.

Third, seek him by reading the Bible. He will talk to you there. It is his love letter to you. Forget your preconceptions, and let go there. If you have never read the Bible, begin in the Psalms and book of John. Talk to God about what you have been reading, and sit still and let him talk to you. Next, seek him for the answers you need in you life. Relationships, finances, troubles, guidance, kids, or whatever you need help with. Seek and you will find.

You may ask what does Henry know about searching for God. In his sophomore year of college, he sat on his dorm room bed wondering why all the dreams of his life had gone. A chance of having a relationship with the girl of his dreams and chance at a college golf career. He had come to a low point in his life. Depressed looking around his room he spotted a Bible on the bookshelf. He opened the Bible and it opened to Matthew 6:33-34. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own. Not being a religious person , he didn't know what God's kingdom and righteousness meant but after reading this, he walked to the empty college chapel and asked God if he was real and if he was, to find him, Henry needed His help. No lightning bolts, nothing miraculous happened until he got a call from an acquaintance who said out of the blue he was led to call Henry and ask him to join his Bible study. Henry joined the Bible Study Group and found God.

Whether you are a young or experienced believer, you may at times need to seek God's presence in your life. You may find God in your quiet place, reading a daily devotional

or by joining a Bible Study. Happy hunting.
