PASTOR JOAN'S COLUMN

When I was preparing the message for the recent Sunday when Trinity would recognize the senior high school graduates, Paul's letter to Timothy came to mind, especially the passage in which Paul tells Timothy, "Let no one look down on your youthfulness. but rather in speech, conduct, love. faith and purity show yourself an example of those who believe" (1 Timothy 4:12). I can't help but think that Paul's statement to Timothy is what everyone, but especially pastors, should follow. We should in our speech and in our conduct always reveal our belief in Jesus Christ as our Savior.

And I say, "especially pastors," because later in his second letter to Timothy, Paul writes, "I solemnly charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus...preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort, with great patience and instruction" (2 Timothy 4:1-2). As a human being, I don't want to offend anyone, but as a Christian, and especially as a pastor, it is my duty to always preach we can't get complacent about that. We need the Gospel, and to preach it correctly. And if someone is offended by that preaching, then that is their sin convicting them, and it is time for them to get on their knees, confess that sin, and repent of it. I have to admit that there have been times in my life when that has happened to me, and sometimes when God gives me a message, I am convicted and have to serve my "knee-time" before I ever get to the pulpit on Sunday morning!

Sometimes, though, it is tempting to "waterdown" the part of the message that deals directly with our sin, but I would be doing everyone, myself included, a disservice if I did that. And I would not be true to my calling from God. As Paul told Timothy, I, too, have to "be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, accurately handling the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15).


Given our secular culture and the influences

In other words, I need to re-EXAMPLE member my duty to preach the Word, FOR BELIEVERS just as Paul told young Timothy, "The IN SPEECH, IN LIFE time is coming when people will not IN LOVE. endure sound teaching; but having AND IN PURITY. itching ears and they will accumulate -1 Timothy 4:12 for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from

> listening to the truth and wander off into myths" (2 Timothy 4:3-4).

At Trinity, we will continue to talk about sin and righteousness and judgment, and yes, even Satan. And we will also give a good healthy dose of God's love for each of us, especially concerning how that love was displayed when His only Son, Jesus, was sacrificed on that cross. Our sins were forgiven when that happened, but constant reminders so we don't fall away from the true gospel. And as believers in Jesus, we also know that Jesus hated the sin even while He loved the sinner. And that is our goal at Trinity - love the sinner and show them the love of Jesus!






