Vacation Bible School registration is for young learners in Pre-K (potty-trained) this coming fall through 6th grade.





- Sizes 6-24 months (may be used)


- 2 pairs of socks

A LOOK AT TRINITY'S PAST

[Editor's Note: This is the start of a new column focusing on the history of Trinity Lutheran Church]

Evangelical Lutheran Church) continues from 1905, some of the next settlers to the Birchwood area were Norwegian Lutherans, who wanted to worship in a church but they couldn't understand the German language. When their pastor came to town on foot or by train, they would gather in the homes for a service.

Pastor Nord was the next pastor to serve. He came in 1907 and stayed until 1912. Being Norwegian, he attracted newer Norwegian settlers. Pastor John Ritland followed and served until 1918.

Around 1920, the congregation changed its name to "Zion Lutheran Church."

1920 -1937 - The Lost Years

HIS IS WHERE OUR CHURCH RECORDS stop for a while. By about 1920, English-speaking ministers filled the pulpit. Apparently Rice Lake sent English-speaking pastors for the next few years, as many of the Germans and Norwegians were beginning to use the English language.

1937-1940 – Foundations for the Future


PASTOR ALFRED E. BERG CAME to serve in 1939. He encouraged the congregation to enlarge and remodel the frame church building. Remodeling was

started in the fall of 1939. The building was raised so excavation could be done for a basement and furnace room. A large addition was added to the north end, making room for a cloakroom and stairs leading to the basement dining room. The colored glass in the windows was replace with panes of white frosted glass. Services were held in the Methodist Church every Sunday afternoon during construction.


