PASTOR JACK INSTALLED AS TRINITY'S 35TH PASTOR IN 114 YEARS



On February 18, the congregation of Trinity Lutheran Church joyfully installed Pastor Jack Jorgensen, the 35th pastor in the church's 114-year history, in a symbolic and meaningful service. Over 130 people attended, including a contingent from Pastor Jack's previous church in Hudson, WI.

President Wally Thom and Worship and Music Ministry Team Leader Jean Jastram led the installation service. Symbols of pastoral leadership were

presented to Pastor Jack by representatives of the congrega-

tion. The Trinity congregation pledged to a congregational covenant, Pastor Jack committed to a pastoral covenant, and both congregation and pastor agreed to a mutual covenant.

Following the service, a potluck meal was shared in the Fellowship Hall. (See related article about the symbols of pastoral leadership on page 3.)

Symbols of Pastoral Leadership

Ten symbols of Pastoral Leadership were presented by selected members of the Trinity congregation to Pastor Jack at his installation service on February 18. The descriptive narrative for each item is provided below.

"Accept this Bible and be among us, as "a man of one book." Be in this place one who preaches the Word.

"Receive this vessel of water, the water of baptism. Be among us a pastor who brings many to the knowledge of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, and to the affirmation of faith pronounced by baptism.

"Receive this hymnal and be among us a leading worshiper at the foot of the cross, that we may worthily magnify the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

"Receive this directory containing a list of all our families. We are your people. Please pray for us, and be a pastor among us who teaches God's full truth to all ages.

"Receive the keys to our church as the caretaker of God's house, and welcome all who enter.

"Receive these giving envelopes and remind us often that we are to be faithful stewards of all God has given us.

"Accept this Lutheran Catechism and the duty of teaching and discipling our people; remind us that, not only are we Christians, but we have a strong Lutheran history.

"Receive this oil, and be a healer and reconciler among us; a model of spiritual leadership.

"Take this bread and cup and with it the authority to administer in Christ's stead the sacrament of Holy Communion among this church.

"Receive this candle. Its flame represents the Presence of the Lord. Please lead us into His Presence when we gather to worship Almighty God"

I see Jesus in you! Walk this journey with us and let it be Less of Me More of Him.



Using selected chapters of the book A Woman Jesus Can Teach by Alice Mathews, the WI-Upper Peninsula District Women of the Word Board Members, with the guidance of Pastor Lori Liverance, from Zion Lutheran Church of Metropolitan (Felch, Michigan) will lead six sessions during the retreat.

In addition, attendees will assemble a craft project and a mission project (materials provided).

The retreat will be held at Forest Springs Camp, in Westboro, WI. This beautiful facility is situated about 100 miles away from Birchwood, along the rustic glacial ridge of north central Wisconsin and offers a wonderful opportunity to unplug, have fun, learn and grow.

The deadline for registration is March 30. Cost is \$85 per person and covers one night's lodging, breakfast, lunch and snack on Saturday, use of the facilities, and retreat materials. Each room can accommodate 4 people.

The Missions and Outreach Committee is continuing to collect items for Project Promise Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief. These kits are shared with people who have lost everything from a natural disaster or life-threatening violence. Give hope through a bar of soap!

Donate items for the kits or collect items and assemble them as described below

ITEMS TO INCLUDE IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT (date to bring)

- ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging or a business-size envelope (Mar 4)
- ❖ ONE sturdy comb (Mar 11)
- ❖ ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional) (Mar 18)
- ONE light-weight bath-size towel (52" x 27"), dark color recommended (Mar 25)
- TWO bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping (Apr 1)

<u>Don't enclose Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.</u> Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.



A basket will be in the narthex until April 8. Unlisted personal or health care items that are donated will be given to the Food Pantry, as there is a need for such things there also.






TRINITY YOUTH RETREAT—MARCH 2-4
