
Council Positions OPEN ... Will YOU Serve? ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING SET FOR NOV 6

All Trinity members are invited and encouraged to attend the Annual Congregational Meeting, immediately following worship, Sunday, November 6.

The Congregational Council will present a 2016 budget update, a proposed budget for 2017, nominations for Council positions, and solicit nominations for the 2017 Nominating Committee. (In accordance with our constitution, the Nominating Committee needs 3 voting members with one, if possible, person who is going off the council.)

Members will vote on the proposed 2017 budget, council positions up for election, Nominating Committee, the minutes from the 2015 Annual Congregational Meeting and the September 18 Special Congregational Meeting, and members will be elected. At press a second ratification vote on revisions to update our constitution and bylaw lan-tions include: Leo Diehl (Pres); Wally guage to reflect a scriptural understanding on marriage. (These revisions were first voted on at the September 18 meeting, and must be ratified by a 2/3 majority on this second vote.)

The proposed 2017 budget was mailed to members this past week, and minutes from the 2015 Annual Congregational Meeting and Special Congregational Meeting are available at the





Welcome Center. Copies will be distributed at the beginning of the meeting for members to review.

PASTOR JON'S COLUMN - "Give Thanks"

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

(1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18)

Now, I know that Thanksgiving falls always on Thursday. But it seems to me that if it were really about being thankful, the day would be on a Friday or Monday so we'd all get that three-day weekend. But I don't believe that is what the Pilgrims were thinking about when they sat down all those centuries ago to share a meal of thanks.

We learn at an early age, at home and at school (at least we used to) that they were celebrating God's blessings of a great harvest in a most difficult time in a brand-new land. And I am sure that they weren't worried about having enough turkey leftover to make sandwiches the next day for the day long, Black-Friday shopping experience!

I am not so naïve that I do not realize that our national holiday is for the most part a secular tradition. Yet, in almost every American family tradition, there is a point during the day when talk turns to what people are most thankful for. Often, the most enjoyable responses tend to come from our youngest who often tell of new toys or pets, but for the most part, we are thankful for the ones we love. Perhaps as we get older we are thankful because we know that our time with them is precious — and limited.

Holidays, especially Thanksgiving and Christmas, are hardest for those who have lost a loved one. They remember the happiness of the season and feel the hard reality that an important piece of that happiness is now gone. In Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, he urged Christ's followers to be joyful at all times – yet that, it seems, is not always possible.



When terrible things happen in our lives—a devastating illness, death of a loved one, a crippling accident, an inability to have children, a break-up—it is only right and just to cry and mourn and scream at God. We ask God, "How could you let this happen?" when we feel like our heart has been cut out. The only way to ride it out is to experience it completely. This ability to feel is what makes us human.

Yet I do not believe that Paul was not telling those folks to hide their true feelings, so they could always be happy. Instead, he was trying to encourage and reassure the early Christians that Jesus was indeed going to come again. In

that knowledge, he urged the Thessalonians to be thankful and to give praise. This is a promise we can find assurance in today.

Sometimes begrudgingly, I have to say, Yes — Paul was correct that we should be thankful in all circumstances —thankful to God for God's goodness and grace, even if we don't feel up to the task. Eventually, it will get better. When you have an open dialogue with Jesus about everything you're feeling — the doubts, the turmoil, the grief — the weight will be lifted from your shoulders and you'll have even more to be grateful for than before. The ultimate goal is to be able to be joyful, prayerful and thankful to the Lord at all times. With God's help, this can be achieved.

This year, when you sit down at your Thanksgiving tables, give thanks for the people surrounding you in love but also give thanks for the creator of love itself. For it is truly right to give God thanks and praise.

Make a joyful noise to God, all the earth; sing the glory of his name; give to him glorious praise. Say to God, "How awesome are your deeds! Because of your great power, your enemies cringe before you. All the earth worships you; they sing you praises to you, sing praises to your name." (Psalms 66, 1-4)

Prayer – Lord, guide me to say a resounding 'YES' to the truth of your Word – in spite of what my feelings might say. Amen!


