The campaign will end run until the end of October, to hopefully raise the full amount.


PANCAKE BREAKFAST

PASTOR JOAN'S COLUMN

SHOUT FOR JOY TO THE LORD,

ALL THE EARTH. WORSHIP THE

LORD WITH GLADNESS; COME

BEFORE HIM WITH JOYFUL SONGS.

PSALM 100:1-2 (NIV)

This is what worship of our Lord is to look like; but somewhere over the years, for certain denominations, it has become more like drudgery. The early church focused on praising God, but by the time of the Reformation, the church had moved so far away from the true meaning of the Bible that very few people really knew what the

Bible taught. The printing press had not been invented yet, so people did not have access to the Bible; therefore, the common populace had to follow the instruction of the priests.

Hymn writers, such as John and Charles Wesley, began putting the truths of the Bible to music which helped the people to learn and remember those truths. The singing of those first hymns became a normal and vital part of their gatherings for worship. The problem with this arose when the ritual of singing hymns became the central part of their worship service. And even after the invention of the printing press, the rituals continued because then people could read instead of memorizing. Therefore, for many people, the meaning of worship became the reciting and singing of the truths of the Bible. However, this is not what the Bible teaches about worshipping God.

Psalm 100 is one of the best passages found in the Bible that talks about how to worship God. I quoted the NIV translation above, but the second verse in the New American Standard says, "Come before Him with joyful singing." The Hebrew word for "singing" is "renanah," which literally means "shout for joy." This word is used over 50 times in the Old Testament. Singing in the Hebrew culture was always joyful, and when I was in Israel last April, we worshipped on Sunday morning on the Sea of Galilee with both modern worship music and Hebrew music. When the Hebrew music was played over the speakers of the boat, it was uplifting and people cleared the chairs away and began dancing in a circle with their arms entwined around each other. It was a feeling of freedom to worship with such abandon!

What is the purpose of worship? God wants us to worship Him, and it has nothing to do with how WE feel. It's not to make us feel better or to even make us feel closer to God. It's not even for the purpose of learning more about God. Worship does do all of these things, but this is not the main purpose, and this is why worship has nothing to do with any type of ritual or even teaching.

Rituals - or traditions - serve the purpose to make us feel better, to

center our minds on God, and they can help us know more about God. Sometimes, we even need them to redirect our thinking. However, rituals have nothing to do with worship.

The purpose of worship is to acknowledge the presence of God and to let God know how much we love Him; therefore, worship is always centered on God! Worship is time spent praising God.

So, if Sunday morning church is time spent praising God, what would worship look like if we were as excited there as we are at a football game – or any other sporting event – or a concert of our favorite singer. If you jump up and down and shout and wave your hands around at those events, you should show the same enthusiasm in a worship service because that is who you are.

However, if you don't express yourself physically at any of those other events, you will probably express yourself the same way in a worship service. God doesn't look at our outward expressions, but rather at what is going on in your heart.

We should be free to express ourselves in worship in whatever way suits our personality, which is how God made each of us. He loves us and wants our adoration and love. He wants to know that we love Him as much as He loves us, so we need to feel free to raise our hands in worship to Him without worrying about what someone else may think. The same is true for those who are not so expressive - there needs to be no judging of one another and our style of worship.

So let's come to worship on Sunday with a heart full of gladness and shout for joy to the Lord!

This was wonderful, to see us all coming together, working together, and helping raise money for a good cause. Many, many, thanks!!

New voices wanted and welcomed! CHRISTMAS CANTATA REHEARSALS START OCT 4


