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From the Golf Course.....

The brush growing on the hillsides that run through our golf course can interfere with play and finding one's ball. I remember mowing those hillsides 30 + years ago by lowering and raising a mower with ropes while standing on the flat topside. Not exactly safety video material.

Former Superintendents and those managing expenses at the golf course decided to focus limited resources on greens, tees, and fairways rather than on those hillsides. Brush and saplings now have grown up on those steep hillsides and shaded out (killed) most of the grass that once grew there. To restore those hillsides to grass would take significant time and money. The brush would have to be eliminated and the bare hillsides would have to be seeded (likely hydro seeded) to prevent them from eroding away. Then the hillsides would have to be mowed and maintained again on a regular basis. Even with advancements in technology, there aren't any mowers available to climb most of those hillsides.

Taking on additional maintenance at the golf course poses two separate challenges. One issue is to pay the labor. However, before paying the labor one must FIND employable people. Finding labor is identified as one of the most challenging aspects of golf course management. Physical labor, early morning and weekend scheduling, rain/cold/heat associated with outdoor work, and seasonal layoffs all make finding labor a real challenge. For now we will do our best to keep the brush knocked down in front of the tees and areas that are closest to play.
