#### From the Golf Course.....

From the Golf Course Superintendent:

I have had discussions with golfers concerning cup placement on the greens. During the peak of the golf season, we change cup locations 3 -4 times per week depending on the volume of play and scheduled events.

Finding an appropriate location for the cup at Danville Country Club can be quite challenging. Our greens are relatively small, quite sloped, and, undulated.

Number 2 green with its extreme slope has only a few fair locations. 11 green is very small with only a narrow band across the middle flat enough to locate a cup. 7 and 12 greens are not small but very undulated with limitations. 8 and 15 greens are small and get abused with short irons. With only a couple of fair sites for cups on those greens, we also have to avoid the craters (ball marks). The back halves of 5 and 10 greens do not accommodate cups.

Modern greens are large, sand-based with plateaus providing enough fair locations that the course can locate cups in a "rotation" with an even number of cups cut in the front, back, center, right, left, etc. The limitations I explained about our greens do not allow for such a rotation. Our greens were constructed by "pushing up" clay-based soils. When greens get dry it can even become physically challenging to get the cup cutter deep enough into the ground.
